## So you don't ride when it Rains.....**WHY NOT ?**



Lets take away all the panic and white knuckle syndrome (Just over reacting and squeezing the dickens out of the grips on the handle bars). Remember it might be raining here but not where you have waiting to go all week and it's raining. **DON'T GIVE UP THE SHIP. RELAX** with a little practice, you can gain the self need skills to ride safely in the rain. I know you wash your bike and riding in the rain means you just get to wash the beast all over again, come on you know you love it, so don't worry about a little water.

Lets get started.....Rain gear. If you don't have the proper gear for riding in the conditions you are in (IE: Cold, Heat and Rain ) you are riding impaired. If you get the correct gear for each season & condition, you will become fearless on the roads. Having the proper gear will help keep the rider fresh so one mind can stay on the road traffic conditions.

**GEAR:** rain suit .....save some time and go up the ladder dollar wise and buy one that really works

I have a helmet with a face shield that I can pull down when it rains. Its all the player choice on what to get / the more gear the dryer the rider.

**How to get started riding in the wet stuff:** just that.....wait until a shower is over and the roads are still wet, and get the feel on how your ride does in wet conditions. It's wet, you can't be aggressive, so slow down. Give yourself a greater stopping window. Don't lean as hard in corners as if you had sure footing. Build you confidence, gain your skills needed to become a better rider and you won't be sitting home because of rain shower.

Safety First and the rest of the ride is always down hill.....HarleyWes Safety Dude

So here's one that I've been to recently that I can recommend highly:

Not all restaurants have to be far away. I've been on many a ride where we will take off, ride for an hour or two, and end up at a good restaurant back here in Tallahassee. Or if it's open for breakfast, a favorite morning ride is to meet, have breakfast, and then hit the road.

We have a new restaurant right here in Tallahassee that is excellent, and will work great for both of these scenarios. This would be **Angelette's Cajun Kitchen at 3551 Blairstone Rd, Tallahassee, FL 32301-8826.** At Blairstone Road & Capital Circle, across from Southwood. I've eaten there many time and never, ever been disappointed! Open for breakfast and lunch, every day except Monday, Serving down the bayou food like gumbo, red beans and crawfish pie for lunch and beignets all day! They have a wide variety of breakfast choices, sandwiches, and plate lunches, and everything I have had has been excellent. Be sure to try the Feed 'Em Grits, with your choice of three toppings, and the blackened hamburger!

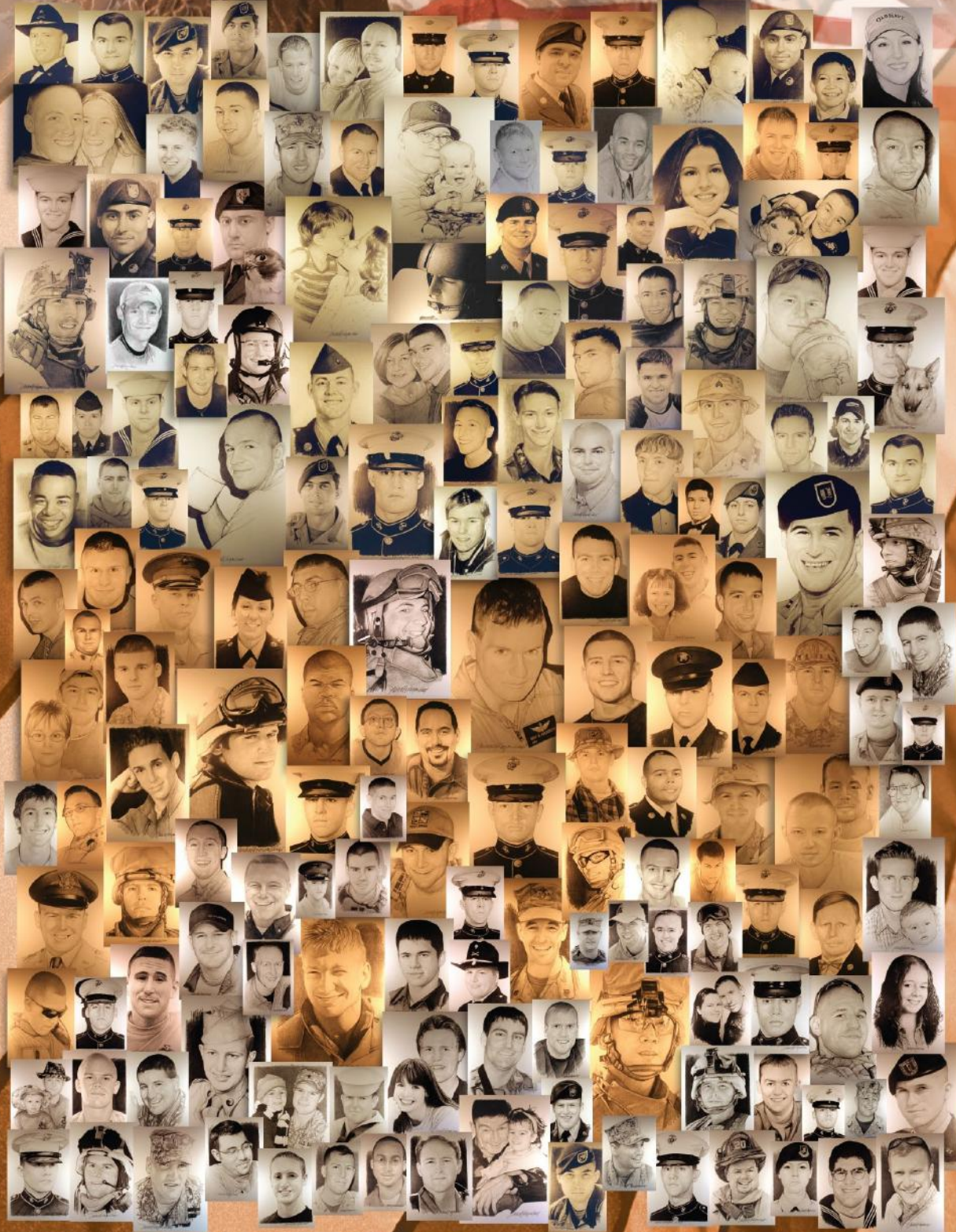
